

Carrickahowley Castle Monochrome

This image is of a medieval Irish "castle" located on the Western Coast of County Mayo, Republic of Ireland. (These types of structures are more accurately considered a "House Tower".) One of the main elements of the landscape is the stream that flows past the structure to the "fiord like" inlet. I wanted to capture the



color and texture of the mosses and have the streambed create a leading line to the structure. I decided to get low for the shot to enhance the effect. To get everything in focus, I used settings to achieve "hyperfocus".



Equipment used was a Nikon D800E mounted on a tripod with the legs spread out to their maximum to get down low to the ground. The lens used was a Nikkor 24mm, f/3.5 Perspective Control (tilt/shift), at f/22, ISO 100. The shot was bracketed 1 f/stop x 9 and then merged into an HDR rendition.

Post process began with RAW editing in Lightroom with the major artistic adjustments completed in Photoshop and NIK software. NIK HDR Effects was used to merge the nine bracketed exposures. Photoshop was used to drop a more interesting sky into the background.

Originally this image was shown in competition as a color image but several years later I used it again as a monochrome version.




Along a Foggy Trail

Also known as the Bunny On The Road. Taken January 8, 2025 out at the Merced National Wildlife Refuge at 8:58 A.M. just as the morning fog was clearing. The Bunny likes the area of the Bittern Marsh trail on the backside of the auto route during foggy winter mornings and can often be seen basking on the trail as the fog clears. Sony a1, 24-105 lens at 39mm. 1/60s, f/11, ISO 100. The photo was taken in a horizontal position and then cropped to a vertical for compositional reasons.



Breakfast at the Window

I set up this still-life photo on my patio. I used a small table and arranged it with natural burlap, a basket of apples, and a pitcher. The background or walls of the photo are a cedar plank backdrop wall and a old wood sash window. The lighting was from a handheld LED light placed in the upper right corner



of the window. I was trying to achieve shadows on the pitcher and

apples that would appear natural from a window. The landscape showing behind the window was from my backyard.

I used my Nikon D850 camera. The exposure was set at 1/100 sec. The ISO was 80. I was using my 24-70 lens with the f-stop at 3.2.

All post-processing was done in Photoshop. I had to tone down some brightness on the burlap, remove distractions from the backyard landscaping (love the remove tool), and altered the photo to monochrome. I then adjusted the mid-tones, and shadows to achieve the look I wanted.


