



It All Began with Easter Baskets or

How I Got Started in Architectural Photography, Part One

Maybe it was mid-life crisis, maybe not. After many years of camera club, personal and PSA photography, I had decided to give up photography "forever", but after a few years, I couldn't stay away. Instead of personal work I decided in 1977, at age 51, to go commercial. I had always been interested in the design


of buildings and admired fine Architecture and since I had been doing landscapes for years and had developed a feeling for outdoor light I decided to specialize in Architectural Photography. However my first commercial venture was photographing Easter Baskets for a firm whose owners sought me out because they were familiar with my camera club photography. My first architectural jobs were of interiors and if I had really known what interior photography involved I might have had second thoughts.

I really wanted to do buildings but couldn't call on Architects because I had nothing to show except photos of Easter Baskets. The big break came through thanks to Camera Club friend, Carl Benson and his electrical engineer partner Jim Graham. Peerless Lighting of Berkeley, California asked them to recommend a photographer in Fresno to do some color slide photography of interiors at Selma Library to show off their new line of light fixtures. A few weeks later they called me to say they were introducing the new line nationally and wanted photography for a national magazine ad. These new light fixtures were installed in various locations nationwide, Fresno Air Terminal being one of them. They asked for 4x5 transparency test shots from each location to decide which to use for the ad. I borrowed a 4x5 Camera and having never used a view camera before, I had to have John Horn at Horn Photo load the film holders for me. Well, Peerless decided to use Fresno Air Terminal for the ad, and informed me that henceforth I would be dealing with their advertising agency in San Francisco. Their agent came to Fresno to accompany me the night of the 'shoot'. I was extremely nervous all day and hardly slept the night before. We were using transparency film and everything had to be right in camera. There's was no going into a computer and photoshopping, Nik-ing or Topaz-ing it until you get it right. (You guys are such sis-Even before 9/11 airport security was very strict. I had to get permission from the airport manager for the test shots and then when I went back for permission for the real shots he actually scolded me. I didn't want to have to go back and didn't want the embarrassment of having to ask the ad man to return to Fresno. By this time I had my own 4x5 View Camera and a 75 mm lens (24 mm equivalent) which I had determined was the right one for the job. This was Peerless Lighting's first national ad and it was my first time to do this sort of job. I'm sure if they had known this was my first they probably wouldn't have used me. Fortunately it all turned out o.k. The picture was used in a full bleed 2 page ad in National Architectural Magazines several times.

Now I had something to show prospective clients. The Ad Agency provided me with full color, full size tear sheets of the ad, so my portfolio consisted of the one image. I called on eleven firms and, though they liked the photo they were already working with a photographer or did their own. Number twelve

hired me to do some black & white for a brochure. That was my start with a local office. I had called on Ed Darden, Jr. of Darden Architects with the Air Terminal ad. His comment was "How do I know it wasn't a lucky shot? Come back when you have something else to show". A few weeks later I went back with BW Brochure photos and his response was "You didn't have much to work with, did you? Come back when you have something else". I resolved I wasn't going back. A few months later he called to try me out on a project that required interior shots which involved various lights, each a different color temperature, combined with daylight window light. So my report to him was "You sure picked a hard one to try me out on". "What does that mean? Does that mean you can't do it?" I said "If it can be done, I'll do it". Various exposures with different filtering had to be done on a single sheet of film. I suppose that can be done easily in Photoshop, but this was pre-digital days and we had to do it the hard way. (Gee, you guys are sissies). It was done to Mr. Darden's satisfaction and he stayed with me until I retired 25 years later. When I first started with Darden Associates it was a four person firm: Ed, Senior, Emeritus, Ed, Jr. Carol, the Secretary and Marty Dietz, young architect fresh out of college. During the intervening years the firm grew to number 65 people. Last year Ed Jr. attained emeritus status and now Marty, no longer young and fresh out of college, is Senior Partner. It is a very fine firm to work with. It is a first class operation and I was fortunate to have the association and shall always treasure the experience.

That's all for now, more in the next installment.

PSA News - PSA Members, and those who wish to become PSA Members

1. Membership Fee and Category Structure

"Ten years ago it cost 34 cents to mail a first class letter. Today we pay 45 cents; an increase of 27%. Third class mailing rates have increased accordingly, and yet PSA membership dues have remained the same for the past 10 years." (This information was in the October PSA Journal) So time has come for a change.

Effective January 1, 2013:

- a. <u>Digital Membership</u> (Adult) includes online and mobile access to PSA Journal Adult \$45 for 1 year, \$80 for 2 yrs, \$120 for 3 yrs, \$200 for 5 years. (new)
- b. <u>Standard Membership</u> (Adult) includes a *printed copy of the PSA Journal by mail* with complimentary access to online and mobile PSA Journal- Adult \$60 for 1 year, \$110 for 2 yrs, \$175 for 3 yrs, \$275 for 5 years (new)
- c. Individual copies of the PSA Journal and Who's Who publication can be purchased for \$5 each.
- d. The current membership fee structure will be in effect through December 31, 2012. Members may take advantage of early renewal of membership through this date. Joint membership and Senior Membership will no longer be available.
