If you browsed through the work displayed in the Fine Arts & Photography Building at the Big Fresno Fair this year, changes are—you probably bumped into Lee Cates.

With her sweet smile and palpable passon for photography, the 93-year-old Fresno Camera Club membership chair spent the majority of the Fair's run in the club's designated section, encouraging passersby to learn the craft. See, even as a young student living in Glenview, Ill., the act of teaching has always been an interest of Cates.

"I was a nerd," Cates admints. "I thought I wanted to be a teacher, and in high school, I used to correct student papers for the teacher."

But then junior year happened. Cates and a girlfriend were stepping off a train at Fort Sheridan when her late serviceman husband Clarence Cates saw Cates and offered to buy her a drink at the canteen. And the rest, as they say, was history.

For the next couple of decades, Cates would follow the master sergeant to posts in various locales



such as Oklahoma, Germany and also Fresno for eight whole days before being transferred somewhere else. The couple liked their short stay so much, they returned to the area in 1959 after Clarence retired. She worked as a medical administrative assistant at what's now VA Central California Health Care System until 1982.

With more time on her hands and Clarence's passing in 1973, her kids gave Cates a Canon point-andshoot camera to "give Mom something to do" in 1982. To say that one piece of equipment left quite an impression on Cates would be an understatement.

The eager novice immerced herself in a camera class held by City of Fresno, and it was through the experience that Cates came across Fresno Camera Club two years later. From shooting slides to now digital images. Cates' enthusiasm for the artistic hobby flourished under the 122-year-old nonprofit's influence, which provides educational and competitive opportunities for anyone in the community with a desire to learn.

Cates says every month there are competitions within the 75-plus member club—alternating between digital and print—as well as instructional programs that specialize in a variety of subjects like Photoshop and lighting. The judging process also allows for photographers to gain another perspective of their and their peers' work-but you don't necessarily have to agree, Cates says.

The organization is made up of all ages, and includes While Cates has stepped down from some of her members from surrounding Central California areas. All those involved are also part of San Joaquin Valley Camera Club Council and are affiliated with the world wide organization, Photographic Society of America.

Cates has earned multiple PSA Star Ratings for her work in color slides and prints, judged for international exhibitions and servied Fresno Camera Club twice as president and tehn editor if its publication, Highlights, before holding her current position.

The PSA Youth Showcase, however, is where her heart truly lies. Since 2002, Cates has promoted the competitive program to Fresno and Clovis Unified School Districts and other outlying communitiesacting as a mentor as well as personal handler of the students' entries. And according to the PSA Journal, there have been several national winners from the region.

responsibilities, she hopes to continue her work with the club and youth program as long as she can continue to drive. (Her license was recently renewed for five more years.)

"To get recognition on a national level is a tremendous inspiration to encourage the kids to keep going." says Fresno Camera Club director Jonathan Rollins, who was originally recruited by Cates at The Big Fresno Fair in 2005. "Lee's been a real force for the camera club and photography in general.

2014 Conference in Albuquerque

by: Stan Bormann Planning is underway for the 2014 PSA conference in Albuquerque New Mexico. The conference hotel is the Albuquerque Marriott located at 2101 Louisiana Boulevard NE. There are two Marriott hotels in Albuquerque so if you are doing research check the address. This is a fine hotel with very adequate conference space. The conference area is located just off the lobby and the Print Gallery will be located where you can enjoy it as you pass by on your way between the conference area and the hotel itself.

The hotel is located within easy walking distance of a variety of restaurants and several areas of significant shopping. There is public transportation in front of the hotel and very adequate free parking. Internet access will be at no charge for those registering at the conference rate. The rate for a room with one king or two doubles is \$99 plus tax per night. You can register to extend your stay at this price for the Balloon Fiesta which starts on Saturday, October 4th. The conference in 2014 will end on Friday, not Saturday to take advantage of the Balloon Fiesta. All conference events will be moved up one day because of this. As an example, the grand opening of the Print Gallery will be Monday evening instead of Tuesday evening as is customary for PSA conferences.

I recommend you go to the following web location to reserve your room at the conference rate. There are a significant number of rooms allocated for PSA,

but they may go fast and nights for the Balloon Fiesta after the conference in particular may be hard to get if you do not reserve early. The link to reserve your room is:
