Camel Thorn Trees-Namibia

Camel thorn trees in the Deadylei near Sossusvlei in the Namib-Naukluft Park. The Deadvlei (dead marsh) was the terminus of the Tsauchab river which runs down from the nearby Naukluft Mts. towards the western coast of Namibia. The river is cut off and terminates in the ancient dunes of the Namib desert which run along the western coast of Namibia and up to the foot of the Naukluft Mts. Approximately 1000 years ago, the terminus marsh was cut off by sand and became completely surrounded by dunes. The Camel Thorn trees in the marsh died thereafter but, because of the extremely dry conditions, their desiccated trunks remain today. The blackened trucks provide a distinct contrast to the white pan and the red of the mineral rich ancient dunes. Definitely worth a visit.


It was taken with a Canon 60D with a Canon 100mm macro lens on a tripod. Settings were ISO 200, f16 at 1/20 sec.

Irish Palette of Greys and Greens by Patrick Rhames

A view of the badly damaged round tower that stands next to St. Tola's Church within the Dysert O'Dea complex near Corofin, County Clare, IE. It captures, again, the beauty of the Irish palette of greys and greens.

Jonathan Rollins, his wife and I were at the first stop on the first day of a trip to Ireland in September of 2015. I photographed a lot of subjects at this location, many of them were rendered in monochrome. Not his one. From the first time I saw this scene and the wide range of subtle variations of greens and greys, I knew that this one would be in color.

The lighting was perfectly diffused by the typical cloudy sky. It is a singular shot with the following settings: 1/320, f/5.6, ISO 400, focal length 29mm. Camera was my Nikon D800E (what else) with a Nikkor 24-70 f/2.8 mounted on a tripod.

Photographic Exhibitions in the Los Angeles Area

For five days after New Year's Day my wife and I were in Los Angeles. While there I visited two photographic exhibitions which were well worth taking the time to see. Thought I'd tell you about them and about another reliable location for photos which I had visited previously.

 Annenberg Space for Photography is located in a high rise complex at 2000 Avenue of the Stars. The Gallery has changing exhibits. When I went, portraits by Timothy Greenfield-Sanders were featured – 151 of them. A virtual reality setup was available so a visitor could feel like he was in the studio during



a shoot. The Annenberg Foundation funds the exhibition and there is no charge to visit. Parking under the building is validated and costs \$3.50 for three hours. Google Annenberg Space for Photography for more information.

2. Bergamot Station is a group of about 30 artists' studios located at 2525 Michigan Avenue in Santa Monica. The facility is in an industrial area of the city and the studios are in rehabilitated warehouses. The art is high end. Most is not photography but that in at least that in two of the studios is. Those studios



are the Rose Gallery and the Peter Fetterman Gallery. You may come away with a higher opinion of the value of your pictures. There is no charge to visit. Google Bergamot Station.

3. Getty Center is a huge art museum located on a hill above the 405 Freeway just before it goes into the Los Angeles basin from the San Fernando Valley. While it houses vari-



ous art formats, it does feature photography. The building itself is an architectural work of art. There is no charge to visit but underground parking costs about \$15.00. A tram transports you from the parking area uphill to the Center. Google Getty Center.



2017 SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY CAMERA CLUB COUNCIL BOARD MEETING REPORT - John Greening

- Anyone submitting makeup entries for a Council competition can do it only one time per year. In addition to the entry forms, now a separate Payment Form clearly marked "MAKEUP" needs to be submitted (http://sivccc.org/wp-content/uploads/2015/01/Payment Forms.pdf). This is in addition to the form for the current month's entries.
- 2. All those entering Council competitions are strongly encouraged to download, print and complete the Payment Form prior to the meeting.

Due to the points they earned during 2016 several FCC members have changed Division Classes for the 2017 Council competitions. The Class placements for 2017 are listed at http://www.sjvccc.org/competition/division-classes/. (NOT YET)

The SJVCCC Board decided that a new, simpler system for Class placement will be used for **2018**. At the end of 2017, in each Division (Pictorial, Nature, PJ, Travel, Color Prints and Monochrome Prints) the total points earned will determine in which Class (A, AA or AAA) participants will be placed for 2018. Those with the six highest totals, no matter which class in which they compete in 2017, will be placed in AAA, the next eight highest will be in AA, and the remainder in A. No longer will it be necessary to 'work your way up' the classes. Thus someone participating for the first time, in 2017 could be placed in Class AAA for the 2018 year.

- 3. Jennifer Doerrie, the Council Print Chair wants to remind us that the size, backing and labeling rules for both monochrome and color prints need to be followed carefully. All of the rules for participating in Council competitions can be found at sjvccc.org (http://www.sjvccc.org/sjvccc-constitution-bylaws-and-policies/).
- 4. Entries are being accepted for the 2017 San Joaquin Valley International Competition. This is sponsored by the our Council and info is available at http://www.sjvccc.org/fie/. All entries must be submitted by March 25th. Judging will take place the following week.
