




This image was taken on January 4, 2017, late afternoon, at Venice Beach in Los Angeles. Everyone appears to be happy. Although it's winter, you couldn't tell from the weather. This street performer (aka busker) was one of about seven acrobats who put on quite a show for the tourists. They attracted a crowd and used "volunteers" from the spectators in some of their stunts. At the end of the show the hat was passed.





The camera was a Nikon D700 and the lens a Nikon 105mm. ISO was 500, shutter speed 1/3200, and aperture f/3.5. Some modifications were made in Lightroom.



Chevy Rust No. 2




This image is a closeup view of the 1937 Chevy Coupe in Bodie State Historic Park (California). Rather than try to get the whole car in the picture, I opted to capture various sections of the car. This view features the grill and right headlight. I also wanted to emphasize the rust, so I increased the vibrance and saturation to "taste" and pumped up the contrast slightly using Adobe Photoshop CS6.

The equipment used was a tripod mounted Nikon D700, Nikko 24-70mm @56mm, ISO 200, 10.0s at f/8. The image was captured as a raw (NEF) file. The final print is on Epson "Ultra Premium Photo Paper Luster" paper using an Epson 3880.







Destiny

This is a composite picture with images from two very different locations. The main image is the Panamint Mountain Range and Devil's Golf Course in Death Valley. The cloud image is from my front yard after a rain storm. The composite was created using layers in Adobe Photoshop CS6 and converted to black and white using Nik Silver Efex Pro 2. Additional dodging and burning was added for impact.

The inspiration for this image comes from the work of master black and white photographer Cole Thompson. I really like his images because they give me pause and



exercise both sides of my brain. Praise goes to him, because he actually waits for clouds to move into position! Not sure how long I would have to wait for a cloud to move into a clear sky ... in Death Valley!



For both images, the equipment used was a Nikon D800E. A handheld Nikkor 24-70 @35mm (1/500s at f/16, ISO 100) was used for the main image (Devil's Golf Course and Panamints), and a tripod mounted Nikkor 24-70mm@70 mm (1/90s at f/19, ISO 100) was used for the cloud. The final print is on Epson "Ultra Premium Photo Paper Luster" paper using an Epson 3880.

This photograph was taken at the World Ag Expo in Tulare last February. I wanted to take photographs of farm equipment so that I would have something to enter in the Arts Alive in Agriculture Exhibit at City Hall the following April. It's the third year that I had taken pictures there, and it's nice to photograph something other than landscapes, scenery and flowers. I used my Canon 60D with a Tamron 18-270mm lens. My settings were ISO 250, f/8, 1/640, focal length 76mm. I did some minor editing in Photoshop Elements.
