

Photography began for Ron Holman around the age of 10 when his father purchased darkroom equipment as a hobby. About seven years would pass before he acquired hisown 35mm camera, a Minolta XD-11. High school friends invited him to join the yearbook staff for his senior year. Jostens selected the resulting yearbook to represent them in a national contest. The book only placed second but a seed was planted. After an initial interest in Engineering Ron sampled college courses in other areas before landing in Journalism at CSU Fresno. He has been a photojournalist since 1986, working at the Visalia Times-Delta since 1989. His varied work includes features, sports, portraits, the occasional stupid human event (A.K.A. breaking news) and personal or commissioned projects as time permits. Over the years his work has been published worldwide in dozens of publications via The Associated Press, the Los Angeles Times, The Washington Post, and even The National Enquirer. Ron has been a member of the National Press Photographers Association since 1986 and a senior member of SportsShooter.com since 2002. He lives in Visalia with his wife Carol and has two grown sons.


Little Kestrel

The kestrel was in the process of launching into flight and was part of a three shot set this being the middle shot. Only natural lighting was used.






Purple Beauty

The picture was shot at 1/90 second at f3.2, with the ISO set at 100. The focal length was set at 82 mm - 35mm equivalent. I like shooting flower pictures, because there are so many ways you can frame and compose them. Besides, they are everywhere.





Mithell's Presbyterian Church

This image was captured in November of 2018, while I was visiting my eldest son and his family in Culpeper, VA. I have a habit, when in places I am not familiar with, of simply wandering the backroads of the area looking for interesting photographic subject matter.

As I travelled South on Rt. 615 (Rapidan Road), Mitchell's Presbyterian Church was one of several subjects that presented itself to me as interesting. I was particularly attracted to the architecture of the building and, of course, the cemetery that was immediately adjacent to it. The clouds were perfect for a dramatic shot.

By the way, Mitchell is a small village between Culpeper and Rapidan.

This image is the product of a bracketed series of 9 exposures, one f-stop apart, from 4 underexposed to 4 overexposed, including one that was properly exposed. Using a tripod, and hyper-focal focusing technique, the aperture was set at f/22 and the focal distance set at 3 ft. The camera used was my Nikon D850 with a Nikkor 24mm perspective control lens. (For those who may not know what the perspective control lens allows, the front half can be shifted up or down to avoid "key-stoning" when photographing tall subjects.) Manual exposure and "pattern" exposure pattern was used with the ISO set at 400.

Post processing started with Lightroom for RAW, then Photoshop and NIK for finishing. Most notable in this was the use of luminosity masks to enhance the dimensional qualities and the use of a NIK mono-

chrome filter that "fades" both the black-point and white-point to create an "artistic" effect that I am particularly infatuated with at this point in time.









Once Upon a Time



I made the "Once Upon a Time" image in Yosemite last October. The image originally was horizontal, but after realizing the main interest was all on the right, I cropped half out and made it a vertical image. It originally was made from five focus-stacked images in Photoshop, I used some color balance sliders on the highlights and shadows, a lot of specific dodging and burning and a little straightening. I particularly worked on getting more brightness at the farthest point in the image, and had two versions, one with more than the other. Although I was hesitant about the brightness, I submitted this version, which had the brighter light at the back, and hoped it gave it a mystical feel.

Metadata: Fujifilm X-T4 on a tripod, f/18, 1/13 sec, ISO 80, 18 mm (equivalent to 28 mm, but cropped down the middle) and focus-stacked
