Oak Leaf Wheel

This image started out as a picture of a "fall color" oak leaf. The setup involved a leaf hanging by its stem, a bright light source above the leaf, and a black foamboard serving as a background - I felt shining a light down on the leaf gave it added dimension. The base image was captured with my camera on a tripod, and I used a remote shutter release to help reduce camera movement. The image was a simple capture, so only minor color, contrast, and sharpness adjustments were necessary. The leaf was isolated using Photoshop's selection tools, thus creating an oak leaf "object."

The oak leaf "object" was then copied into a new Photoshop document and served as the basis for an array of images rotated around a pivot point. Here is a link to a YouTube video that demonstrates the basics of how to create an array using the "Free Transform" edit in Photoshop. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lw69mxbMw9s For more info on the technique, Google "create circular array with Photoshop."

Each instance of the leaf is a separate layer stacked on a previous "transform." Notice the leaves are overlapping, but when the final image is generated on the stack it hides the overlapping effect I needed for the last leaf. To preserve the effect, I added a mask to the last leaf to reveal a portion of the underlying leaf, thus the illusion was complete!

At his point I merged the transformation layers into a single layer creating the wheel. The wheel had a center opening that I felt needed content, so I duplicated the wheel to a new layer, flipped it on its vertical axis, and "squirshed it" (reduced its size) to fit in the center of the main wheel. As a final touch, I dropped a single leaf apart from the wheel to give the viewer a sense of context and scale ... that's it ... Oak Leaf Wheel!

Tech Specs: I used a tripod mounted Nikon D70, NEF (Nikon raw file), Nikkor 50mm f/1.8, f/11, 1/60 Sec, and ISO 200. Post processing was done with Photoshop CS6 and the print was on Kirkland glossy inkjet paper using an Epson 3880 with UltraChrome® K3 inks.






A Hummingbird Abstract


This a composite image created in PhotoShop. The original hummingbird photo was taken with a Canon 5D mk3 with a 100-400 mm lens at 330 mm, f/7.1, ss 1/200 with flash. PhotoShop was used to select and then copy the hummingbird from the background. This "seed" image was then copied to multiple layers and manipulated using the Transform tools. Playing around with these tools produced the image here.



Northern India Itinerary and Costs

Day 1: July 16. Pickup from the Leh airport, transfer to hotel…rest at hotel before dinner walk around the Leh. Many shops sell Pashmina shawls and scarves made from the hair of the goats raised by the Changpa Nomads whom we will photograph on day 7.

Day 2. Monastery Day! Photograph early morning Puja or prayer ceremony at the Thiksay monastery and back to hotel for the breakfast. After breakfast we will drive to the Lamayuru Monastery and in route visit the Alchi monastery and drive back to Leh. Overnight at the hotel in Leh.

Day 3. Drive to the Nubra Valley via the Khardong La Top road. This is the world's highest motor able road (5600 meters). We will spend the night in a fixed tent camp. In the evening we will photograph and ride the double hump camel (Bactrian camels) in the sand dunes and overnight in the camp. Photograph sunrise on the dunes.

Day. 4... Full day to visit the teaching by his Holiness, the Dalai Lama. There will be hundreds of Buddhist monks and locals dressed in traditional Ladhaki outfits. There will be dances and you will have a chance to be immersed in the beautiful and friendly Ladhaki culture.

Day 5.. Drive back to Leh via Shayok, on the visit the most photogenic Pangong Lake where there are many bird species indigenous to the area including Great Crested Grebe, Red Crested Pochard, Black Necked Crane, an endangered species,

Bar Headed Goose, Brahminy Duck, and the Northern Shoveler, Golden Eagle, Lammergeier, Himalayn Griffon, Common Hoopoe, Great Rosefinch, ,Common Redstart, Lark, Magpie, Pink Colored Crow, Swift, etc. This place is a hot spot for bird diversity. Drive to Sakti for the monastery festival and stay at Home stay.

Day 6. Visit the Sakti Festival until lunch. This incredible festival will have monks dressed in elaborate costumes dancing to traditional music. In the afternoon we will drive to Lake Tsomoriri where the Changpa Nomads raise Pashmina goats for their hair. This is a culture that is dwindling in numbers and live on the Changthang Plateau. We will spend the night in the tents on the plain very near the nomads tents. We will meet and photograph the nomads. The nomads milk the goats early in the morning and we will photograph the procedure. Nomads also weave Yak wool in front of their yurts (tents) which they use in construction of their tents.

- Day 7..Full day to explore the area around the lake and to see the lifestyle of nomads.
- Day 8. Drive back to Leh with the evening free for shopping. Stay at Hotel.
- Day 9. After breakfast at the Hotel we will transfer to the airport and have an early morning flight to Delhi and then drive straight to Agra. Overnight in Hotel in Agra.

Day 10. 26 July. Visit Taj Mahal with morning sunrise and drive back to Delhi. We have day use at a hotel and we will visit the Chandni Chowk market with an evening transfer to the international airport for further flight.

Package includes flight from Delhi to Leh and return. All local transfers from airport to hotel and auto travel, all hotels, tent camping and meals. All fees for access to festivals and Taj Mahal. Bottled water will be provided throughout trip.

Trip does not include flights to and from Delhi. Trip does not include medical and travel insurance.

Leh is at 3500 meters. When we travel around Ladakh we will be going all the way up to 4500 meters just to get over some passes. Altitude sickness can be avoided with proper precautions. When we fly in we will take it easy and let our bodies get used to the altitude. It is recommended to not drink alcohol or use tobacco. It is advisable to procure medicines which you should get prescribed by your doctor for altitude sickness before you travel. Drink lots of water which will be provided. After the first couple of days most healthy people have adapted to the altitude and will be fine.


