

This image was composed in Photoshop from two separate images. The first background image was taken in the Anza Borrego Desert while on vacation, then I adding a slight motion blur. The second subject image was taken at the Squaw Valley Rodeo ground's during a roping competition, concentrating on freezing the

action with shutter priority using my Nikon D70 camera and 70 to 300mm zoom lens.

Then I concentrated on the lighting, sharpness, and color correction on both images so they would match. Next, I cut, drag, and paste the layers. Most of my time was spent blending at a pixel level to produce a final image. My main goal is to produce an image that looks believable but there is still much room for improvement.

This photo was taken in the ghost town of Metropolis NV, near Wells. This is the last remaining bit of the Lincoln School house main entrance.

I shot it earlier in the day and then came back around 2:00am to photograph the milky way with the arch. I had a 30 second exposure, the first ten seconds were spent light painting the arch. I then ran up the stairs where I had a headlamp on the ground already on and stood still for the rest of the exposure to get the silhouetting effect. This was 30 sec, F4, 2500 ISO, 14mm lens on a Nikon D800.





Eureka Dunes and Tiles

This image was taken on 12/27/2015. David Hunter and I had travelled to the Eureka Dunes in Death Valley National Park. (I've never been so cold in all my life. The first night it got down to 15f). This was day two of our visit. These clouds blew in while we were walking around the dunes shooting.

David actually first located this site with the tile formation pointing back to the dunes. Of, course, I had to wait for him to get his shots before I shot it. We have similar images, but not exactly the same. I was shooting with a different lens and I took a little different position in relation to the lines of the tile.

I was using my trusty Nikon D800E with a Nikkor 24-70, f/2.8 zoom lens. ISO was set at 100, f stop set to f/22 at 24mm. Focal distance was set at hyperfocal distance, or about one meter. This is a composited image rendered from nine bracketed images. The shutter speeds were relatively slow, so a tripod was used.

Post processing was done, initially, in Lightroom, then in Photoshop and NIK software. NIK Silver Efex Pro 2 was used for the monochrome treatment. Maybe of interest to others is the use of a "more or less" magenta filter, in post, that helped give the dunes some nice highlighting.

As mentioned, this is an HDR composit, but the sky was treated differently. The clouds were moving so fast that in the composited image they created an un-natural herringbone pattern. To overcome that, I used one of the bracketed images, singularly, to "drop in" a natural looking sky.





### New PSA Definition for Photo Travel Effective January 2016

**Clarifications concerning the Updated Photo Travel Definition:** 

A Photo Travel image expresses the characteristic features or culture of a land as they are found naturally. There are no geographic limitations. Images from events or activities arranged specifically for photography, or of subjects directed or hired for photography are not appropriate. Close up pictures of people or objects must include features that provide information about the environment. Techniques that add, relocate, replace or remove any element of original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. The only allowable adjustments are removal of dust or digital noise, restoration of the appearance of the original scene, and complete conversion to grayscale monochrome. Other derivations, including infrared, are not permitted. All allowed adjustments must appear natural.
