You have to hike in about a mile just so you don't get any footprints as it has become quit poplar. Again I used my Canon 5D Mark III with the 24/105 lense. Silver effects was what I used for the monochrome.

In my neighborhood last December, I noticed a tree full of small, red berries and birds. I thought the birds were Sparrows but grabbed my Nikon Z5 and 24-200mm lens and took a few shots. Turns out they were Cedar Waxwings. I took 500 to 600 more hots. (Thank you digital photography)

For this one I had my Nikon set in the "P" mode - Programed Auto, with auto focus, and Auto Bracketing (3 shots) The camera chose f6.3, 1/320, ISO 280. My lens was zoomed to 200mm.

In Photo Shop I increased the saturation to bring out the natural colors, and cleaned up the background to remove distractions.



This service is especially helpful if the maker wants to have his/her skills evaluated, if the maker would like to know what constitutes an acceptable image in one of the PSA Divisions, or for previewing Images before entering them in club competition or a PSA recognized Exhibition.

PSA also has an <u>Image Analysis Course</u>, which is helpful in judging ones own photos or becoming a certified judge.

PSA Member Galleries - For All PSA Members


