

Napoleon Bridge in Lyon France

This evening image of the Napoleon Bridge in Lyon France shows the extensive lighting that the city provides for its monuments. The bridge crosses the Saone River and provides access to the historic part of the city, the Vieux Lyon. Ancient Gauls, Romans, and the soldiers of Charlemagne all occupied the hill on the right.

A travel tripod was set up along the river walkway, and the image was taken with an Olympus EM1 II with an 12-40mm lens. Settings were ISO 200, f5 at 1.6 sec. Post-processing was primarily in Lightroom with some final adjustments made in Photoshop CC.











Phifer Beach, Big Sur

Phifer Beach, Big Sur is on highway one south of Carmel. I took this photo about five years ago with a Canon 50d. I used a Canon 24mm to 105mm zoom lens set at 30mm at an ISO of 200 with an f8 aperture setting. This is the second time I've gotten a high score with an image taken with my old 50d. It just goes to show that you don't necessary have to use a high dollar camera to get good shots.

Highway one, near this location, is currently closed due to a huge mud slide last winter and will be for quite some time. It's a beautiful area to photograph so if you get a chance, check the news about the road condition and visit this place. Don't wait till too late in the afternoon because fog rolls in very quickly.



This image had part of the ocean visible but it was washed out and very distracting so I did what any Photoshop user would do, I put bushes and rocks in its place.






Inside Art

As part of our 80th year celebration we are having Ronald Webb come in to teach the basics of traditional film based photograph y. we are excited to be offering this class at No Charge, during our celebration weekend, this will be on Friday from 5pm-6:30pm at the New Horn Photo, same shopping center just in the back corner next to Sierra Nut House. We look forward to seeing you there.

Here is a little bit about Ronald Webb, one of the Premier photography instructors we have here in the central valley.

I've been addicted to photography since I bought my first camera in 1977 while living and teaching on the island of Kwajalein in Micronesia. Originally, I was a self-taught photographer who was fortunate enough to take classes and participate in workshops taught by some of the great "American Masters of Photography". I've been on a four-decade journey filled with the excitement and satisfaction that comes from nurturing an artistic longing within this technological medium. My reward has been a 40year career teaching camera/darkroom skills, visual composition/messaging, and sharing the personal joy found through photography to students ranging from elementary school age to senior adults. I retired in 2014 from full-time teaching of high school photography, but I still mentor young photo teachers and have remained an active photo documentarian on contract with Clovis Unified School District. I'm the grateful one who gets to say... "My passion became my life-long profession."

Presentation Synopsis:

Since 1888, when George Eastman introduced the Kodak camera, the industry has been on a quest to make it easy for anyone to be a photographer. A simple "point and shoot" camera that required little technical know-how made this all possible. "You push the button, we do the rest" was George Eastman's advertising mantra that built an industry that thrived for 111 years. The demise of film-based photography began in 1999 with the introduction of consumer market digital cameras. It remained on a steady decline with many declaring it was "dead" in 2012 when Kodak announced that it quit manufacturing it's prized Ektachrome film. The simplicity and abundance of digital cameras has resulted in digital images created at record levels. Everyone seems to have an inexpensive and simple way to photograph the world around them.

Fast forward a brief 5 years and there's now a revitalized interest in film-based photography significant enough for the industry to take notice and reinvest. For serious new photography enthusiasts and pros, shooting on film with cameras that offer greater exposure control and watching your prints magically appear in the darkroom chemicals is an indescribable experience that finds no equal in today's world of point and shoot digital photography. We will look at issues and information that will help film-based enthusiasts get off to a knowledgeable, positive, and rewarding experience.





Yosemite Renaissance 33—Call for Participation has begun!

Submission deadline – Sun. November 26th, 2017 The Yosemite Renaissance Exhibition is an annual exhibit that offers an opportunity for artists inspired by nature and the American wilderness to display and promote their art. The exhibit opens at the historic Yosemite National Park Museum Gallery in the heart of Yosemite Valley, then travels to other art centers across California.

For over 150 years, artists have played an important role in the establishment of our state and national parks, inspiring people to visit iconic natural sites, and to protect our natural resources.

Subject matter must be related to the landscape, environment, wildlife and people of Yosemite National Park and the Sierra Nevada region. Both representational and non-representational submissions are allowed. We encourage artist who apply to celebrate the beauty and wonder of nature through art, but also to consider and explore environmental issues, ecology, biology, forestry, and other scientific, political, spiritual and cultural themes.

Artists should consider that one of the goals of Yosemite Renaissance is to encourage innovation. While the mastery of traditional media, technical expertise, style and personal vision are important factors in the selection process, jurors will also consider the use of new tools, technologies and materials, innovative applications of traditional media, unique styles and / or personal vision, interpretations inspired by current events, and works that express trends in our environment and in our culture. Contributing artists should be aware of the geographic range of the show. While the nexus of the exhibit is Yosemite, the scope of the show also includes Sequoia National Park, Sierra National Forest, Ansel Adams Wilderness, Mono Lake, Bodie, the White Mountains, and more. The high Sierra, east

side and west side foothills and canyons from Lake Tahoe to Tehachapi are all included! The area is huge, consisting of hundreds of thousands of acres of rugged peaks, deep valleys, forests, chaparral, deserts, lakes and streams. If your work is inspired by these places, it will be considered.

Awards

\$5,000 in cash awards will be announced at the opening reception at the Yosemite National Park Museum Gallery.

Submission Guidelines

The exhibit is open to artists living and working worldwide. All submissions must be completed in English. Participating artists must be able to communicate in English, either directly or through an interpreter.

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
