(There is a nasty rumor circulating that at least one member of the current board of directors, and his partner in crime [also a board member], are planning one such expedition in we know best, the the near future. It's a shame they cannot bring home a 10 between them. Maybe the partner in crime's wife will.)


Anyway, I pontificate to the point of divagation.

The point is, while we all do wait with great anticipation all of those awe inspiring images that will, inevitably, appear before us in future competition, travelling off to exotic and photographic places is not a necessary ingredient to awesome photography. There is an abundance of photographic treasure right here in our own back yard (well, maybe not my backyard right now, the neighbor's cat [who has apparently adopted me] has made another early morning dove kill and there are feathers everywhere.)

I, again, divagate. Back to the pontification.

I am reminded of what the late Hanna Barsam once told me when I was just a pup photographer. He told me: "Kid, go out onto the back roads and into the picturesque valley and mountains around us. You will always find something to shoot". (I am convinced he was speaking photographically, and not in reference to firearms.) I have done just that and have been rewarded with some of my most interesting images. A simple old barn near Ahwahnee turned into one of the best shots I've ever taken. The point is, and I'm only repeating what most well know photographers espouse, there are tons of in-

teresting places and things to photograph all around us. As photographers, we train ourselves to see them where most folks fail to do so. Many "top tier" photographers actually tell us to shoot what topography around us, to get our best shots.



What this pontification is leading to is an interesting photography discovery I made, since we last met. One which I want to pass on to all of you. It is a discovery, albeit not in our San Joaquin Valley backyard, but certainly in our State of California back yard.

I happened to be cruising over to the Central Oregon Coast and saw something that made me stop in my tracks. There on Oregon State Route 42, between I5 and Bandon, was, of all things, a covered bridge. You heard me right: a covered bridge just like the ones in Vermont.

I was dumbstruck (Yeah, I know. Some of you think that is a perpetual state with me). I thought (to myself) that would be a great photograph. Well, the surprise is that there are more than just one covered bridge in Oregon. In fact, according to my research, Oregon has the most covered bridges of any place West of Vermont. In fact, no less than 53 of them. I'll include a couple of websites where you can confirm what I am telling you. (Incidentally, the Central Coast of Oregon is also a target rich environment for photographers. You will see I am not exaggerating in the coming months.)

Yosemite Valley Fog was captured on December 16, 2014 on a cold and foggy morning in Yosemite. It was a matter of being patient and waiting for the right moment as the fog was ever changing and completely obliterated the view at times. I shot the image with a Canon 7d using a 24 to 105 mm zoom lens at 24 mm, a polarizing filter was attached. ISO was 160, f stop f16, 1/40th of a second shutter speed on a tripod.

Image was taken in a shopping center in Rostock, Germany, while taking a 12-day Baltic cruise. We were sitting at an ice cream shop in a mall, when I looked up thought that the view would make a nice image.

I used my Panasonic Lumix GX7 micro four thirds camera with my 14-150mm Olympus lens. The settings were a shutter speed of 1/250 sec, aperture f/9 and an ISO 200. The image was processed in Photoshop Elements 13.




